Title: Integration of Tribal Values

WHEREAS, the Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (Central Council) is a federally recognized tribe with more than 29,000 tribal citizens; and

WHEREAS, our 2014 theme is "For Our Future Generations"; and

WHEREAS, Our Tribal Values/Our Way of Life is an invaluable component of Central Council's mission- to preserve our sovereignty and enhance our cultural resources; and

WHEREAS, regular referral and use of Our Tribal Values/Our Way of Life, as taught and identified by our tribal elders and ancestors, is essential when providing services to our tribal citizens and families and community; and

WHEREAS, the utilization of Our Tribal Values/Our Way of Life promotes sovereignty, cultural awareness, Native Pride as well as increases clients/staff understanding of our heritage.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Seventy-Ninth Tribal Assembly of Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska delegation convened in Juneau, Alaska on April 9-12, 2014, hereby mandates Central Council managers incorporate and promote a culture of encouragement by increasing employees/clients understanding of Our Tribal Values/Our Way of Life by requiring the use of our Southeast Tribal Values to their workplace; and


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Central Council's managers incorporate our Tribal Values in their employees evaluation process and also use a measure of their success in working with Tribal clients and families and community; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Central Council managers will report in writing at the 2015 Tribal Assembly on how the clients/staff understanding of Our Tribal Values has increased both in the Tribe's workplace and with the clients they serve.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, this report shall be shared with other organizations to encourage them to actively practice Our Tribal Values.


