Title: Seeking Community Homeless Solutions for Southern Southeast Alaska

WHEREAS, the Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (Central Council) is a federally recognized tribe with more than 29,000 tribal citizens; and

WHEREAS, Ketchikan serves Southern Southeast Alaska as the hub for those who are homeless and seeking shelter. This population includes children, children with families, elderly, physically disabled, and those suffering from chronic alcohol/substance abuse; and


WHEREAS, the Seeking Community Homeless Solutions (SCHS) Task Force of the Ketchikan Wellness Coalition is dedicated to assessing and procuring a 24/7 shelter to meet the above mentioned housing need as well as increasing collaboration of homeless service providers in Southern Southeast Alaska; and

WHEREAS, a building with suitable space and location has been identified pending a structural analysis. If viable, the task force would then lease the building from its owner in order to remodel and bring the building up to code.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Seventy-Ninth Tribal Assembly of Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska delegation convened in Juneau, Alaska on April 9-12, 2014, hereby requests the Seeking Community Homeless Solutions Task Force partner with Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska for the purpose of accomplishing the goal of procuring a 24/7 shelter and comprehensive program in our Ketchikan community through identifying funding and providing staff support.


