Resolution TA/ 15-17

Title: Job Training Recruitment

WHEREAS, the Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (Central Council) is a federally recognized tribe with nearly 30,000 tribal citizens; and

WHEREAS, our rural southeast communities have experienced a detrimental decline in population which has resulted in loss of rural representation, and detrimental negative impact on school funding, municipal funding; and

WHEREAS, the decline has also had negative impact on rural businesses within our communities whose operational costs either remain the same; or increase due to decreased users; and

WHEREAS, the out migration is direct result of no jobs in our villages; and

WHEREAS, the only option for population increase is availability of jobs; and

WHEREAS, we, as a region, can take pro-active steps to train our young adults for jobs either available now such as Alaska Marine Facility in Ketchikan in great need of welders and for future projects such as Alaska Gas line.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Eightieth Tribal Assembly of Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska delegation convened in Juneau, Alaska on April 15-17, 2015, will coordinate combined organized efforts for the development of outreach recruitment program for the training for our young adults. This activity level will be pre-Alyeska pipeline type.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the department(s) needed are already in place so should not divert nor require new personnel. This may in fact provide deliverance on existing program goals/requirements.
